The Story

The Annunciation Trust was formed in 1993. It primarily provides support for the ministries of Henry Morgan, Sylvia Morgan, Paul Booth, Julian Maddock, Sister Rachel Overton and Colin Brown. We meet regularly, sometimes with others more loosely associated with The Trust, to encourage each other and have conversations in the area of spirituality.

The Trust has an ethos based around the annunciation story in the Bible (Luke 1: 26-38). This tells of a young woman hearing a call from God, which both terrifies and excites her, but sustained by God she accepts it. The story speaks both to our own condition and to the ministry to which we find ourselves called, outside the formal structure of the Christian church: a ministry of helping men and women discern their own calling from God and to follow it.

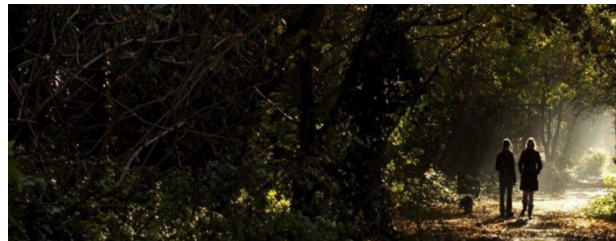
When meeting with individuals we ask for a donation to the Trust, which may be Gift Aided, rather than having a fixed fee.
